



Newburyport/Rockport Commuter Rail Weekend Schedule July 8 – September 30, 2017

Options for travel during bridge construction and train improvements

What's going on and when?

Saturdays and Sundays from July 8 to September 30 no trains will operate on the Newburyport/Rockport Commuter Rail line because the MBTA is installing Positive Train Control (PTC) infrastructure, which is making trains safer. However, the MBTA will be operating a bus shuttle between Boston and several stations in order to keep weekend customers moving.

How will I get up to the North Shore or to Boston?

The Newburyport bus shuttle will stop at Newburyport, Ipswich, Beverly Depot, Salem, and Boston.

The Rockport bus shuttle will stop at Rockport, Gloucester, Ipswich, Manchester-by-the-Sea, Beverly Depot, Salem, and Boston.

How much is parking?

Parking will be free at all stations north of Beverly depot.

What's the weekend bus schedule?

The weekend diversion schedule is on the reverse side of this flyer. It's also available at North Station and on mbta.com.

How long will my trip take?

The trip will take about the same time as if you were driving. Please see the schedule on the reverse side of this flyer to plan your trip.

How much will my trip cost?

The special weekend fare is \$10 round trip. Two children, ages 11 or under, ride free with 1 adult. Zone 3 or higher monthly passes will be accepted.

- North Station

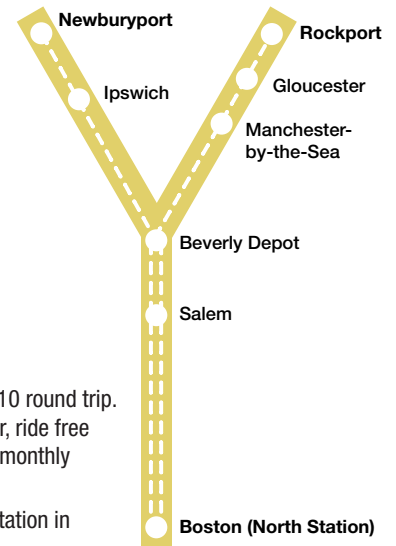
Special fares
